Deann and John Nystrom lost their 14 year old Bichon Friese, Andy, in May 2010. Even with two other dogs, Duke, a 4 year old Maltese and Finn, a 1 year old Yorkie, their house felt empty without Andy. They also knew that Finn would eventually move out with their daughter, Kassie, and they wanted a playmate for Duke.

Deann asked a friend of hers who volunteers at Paws Animal Rescue to watch for a dog that might fit their family. In December 2010, Deann received a call from her friend saying Macee Mae might be a good match. Deann says she "hoped she would be the right dog to fit into our family. I went over and met her at her foster home and sure enough she was the one."

After meeting Macee Mae, Deann filled out the adoption form. Her application was reviewed, references called, and 3 days later she was approved for adoption. Deann said the adoption process was easy and she "would do another adoption if we ever were to get another dog."

# Cassie Adams Memorial

Cassie Adams and her mom were regular volunteers at Paws Animal Rescue. Cassie lovingly cared for the cats and eventually adopted Sloane. She seemed to be drawn to the cats who needed special attention. Cassie could often be found in a corner comforting one of the cats who was new and scared of its new home. It was no surprise to anyone that Cassie adopted Sloane, as she was one who needed that special attention Cassie provided.

On November 22, 2009, Cassie left this world. Her mother, Sondra, and some of her friends made this quilt in memory of Cassie. When making the quilt, they decided the quilt should have some special meaning. Sondra has described for us the different symbols, what they mean, and how they relate to Cassie.

Throughout the quilt you will see butterflies. In the Native American culture, butterflies mean transformation from one journey to another. You will see that the pink center consists of butterflies. But butterflies had an even deeper meaning for Cassie and Sondra. Sondra already had a tattoo of a butterfly holding a smaller butterfly. This symbolized the mother and daughter bond they shared. Cassie had wanted a tattoo and they decided that when she turned 18 they would both go in and have a butterfly tattooed on their shoulders. This was Sondra's way of "releasing" Cassie into the adult world.

Sloane, the cat Cassie adopted, was absolutely adored by Cassie. You will see pictures of a black and white cat that looks a lot like Sloane. Animals were a big part of Cassie's life.

She loved the color purple and she loved music. You will find musical notes within the quilt.

The back of the quilt is pretty much made up of doodling. Cassie doodled all the time and Sondra said you couldn't pick up one of her notebooks without it being covered with those doodles.

They chose the water blue as it represents first medicine which means without water we cannot live.

White represents calm.

When they started the quilt, the song "If I Die Young" had just been released. There is a verse that says "Lord, make me a

rainbow, I'll shine down on my mother. She'll know I'm safe with you when she stands under my colors". You will see a rainbow in the quilt.

The four corners of the quilt represent a Shoshone emblem. Each of the four quilters made their corner of the quilt as a special tribute to Cassie.

Along with Sondra, those helping with the quilt were January Myers, Monica Hernandez, and Brenda Black. Cassie's family have donated this quilt in memory of Cassie with the request that funds raised go toward the building fund so that some day all abandoned animals will have a place to go to. Cassie, we miss you.
